The **Appropriate Pharyngitis Testing Measure** evaluates children, 2 to 18 years of age, who are coded with a single diagnosis of pharyngitis and are prescribed an antibiotic. Those who received a group A streptococcus (strep) test will pass the measure and those who do not have a strep test will fail. If you perform a strep test that will be read by a laboratory, the lab will bill it automatically. However, if you are performing a rapid strep test in your office, please ensure that you are billing for it with the **CPT code 87880.** 

The **Appropriate Upper Respiratory Infection Treatment Measure** evaluates the children, 3 months to 18 years of age, who are coded with a diagnosis of upper respiratory infection (URI) as their only diagnosis during that office visit. The child will pass the measure if they are <u>not</u> dispensed an antibiotic prescription. If the child is coded with multiple diagnoses such as fever and URI, the child will not fall into this measure.

As you already know, it is important to always code as completely and accurately as possible. It will make a positive difference in our HEDIS® scores if you code all diagnoses used in your decision to prescribe antibiotics. Please note that for both of these measures, if there is more than one diagnosis during the office visit, the child will not fall into the measure.

Attached you will find a criteria receipt. After reviewing the standards for these measures, please sign and fax this receipt to Stephanie Scharpf at (410) 433-4615.
