For a visit to count as a well-child visit, it must be coded with one of the following CPT codes: 99381-99385 or 99391-99395(as age appropriate). In addition, you may use one of the following V Codes for a well-child visit: V20.2, V70.0, V70.3, V70.5, V70.6, V70.8, or V70.9, as appropriate.

HEDIS<sup>®</sup> **Well-Child Visits Measures** also examines the percentage of children between the ages of 3 and 6 years old and adolescents between the ages of 12 and 21 years old who receive a well-child visit at least once a year. <u>Please ensure that all patients between 2 and 21 years old</u> receive an annual preventive well-child visit.

In addition, please remember to document the visit appropriately, according to EPSDT standards, and use the codes listed above. If a patient has received care from another physician, please be sure to request the medical record as well as note in your records the physician and the facility where your patient received care.
