# **Adult Preventive Health**

- All patients should receive a physical at least once a year
- Cervical cancer screenings every three years for women under 30 or every 5 years with HPV check for women over 30
- Breast cancer screenings every 2 years for all women over 50
- ✓ SSI Adult—all members in the SSI program need to be seen at least once a year

# Heart Health

- Statins: members with cardiovascular disease should receive at least one high-intensity or moderate-intensity statin medication throughout the year and remain on the medication 80% of the treatment period
- ✓ BP: members with hypertension should strive to keep blood pressure below 140/90

## **Diabetics**

- **Eye Exam**: receive a dilated eye exam at least once every two years if they negative for retinopathy
- ✓ BP: Blood pressure has to be < 140/90</p>
- ✓ HbA1c: HbA1c levels monitored every 3 months should be <7</p>
- Statins: 40-75 years of age should receive at least one statin medication of any intensity and remain on the medication 80% of the treatment period.

#### **Pregnant Women**

- ✓ Need 1 prenatal visit during the first trimester
- ✓ Need 1 <u>flu shot</u> between July 1<sup>st</sup> of the previous year and their delivery date
- ✓ Need **1** <u>Tdap</u> during their pregnancy
- ✓ Need 1 post-partum visit on or between 7 and 84 days after delivery

## **Asthmatics**

✓ Need to fill their asthma controller medication more often than their albuterol/levalbuterol inhaler

#### **Opioids**

- ✓ Confirm with your patient that they are going to one prescriber and one pharmacy for their opioids
- ✓ Do not go over the average morphine milligram equivalent dose (MME) >=90
- ✓ Ensure that your patient days' supply run out before prescribing more opioids
- ✓ For first time opioid prescriptions, always give a 7-day supply. If more is needed do not exceed a 14day supply

## **Antibiotics**

- Patients diagnosed with bronchitis, bronchiolitis or an upper respiratory infection should NOT be prescribed antibiotics unless there is an additional diagnosis
- Patients diagnosed with pharyngitis should NOT be prescribed antibiotics UNLESS they receive a strep test and/or there is an additional diagnosis
